ELDERS CORNER

Doctrine: Reconciliation Colossians 1: 21-23

RECONCILIATION is defined as the process by which two parties at odds with each other are brought back together. Our passage speaks of God, through Jesus, being reconciled both to "all things" and with you, His former enemies.

The combination of these two recalls the fall described in Genesis 3 wherein the God (a Holy God cannot have fellowship with sin) is separated by the sin of Adam and Eve not just from them but from all of creation which likewise begins to suffer the penalty—sin's costly consequences. But God had a plan from the beginning, promising (Gen 3:15) and delivering rescue in the form of Jesus Christ, the One who would sacrificially redeem (paying the debt required) in order to reconcile or restore the broken relationship between God and His creation—allowing us to enjoy fellowship with God in this life and for eternity.

He does so by uniting us to the death and resurrection of His flesh in our place (v 22). We gain His righteousness in place of our unrighteousness so that we can, as Adam and Eve before, stand unashamed in the very presence of a Holy God!

What does reconciliation with God mean to you? It is a personal transaction for each believer. Remember that Peter, who denied Christ thrice before the cross, was compassionately restored (John 21) by Christ's repeated questions, giving Peter the opportunity to thrice testify to his love. Peter's reconciliation mended their relationship, and he was restored as the leader Christ empowered to lead the disciples and the early church through service and Christ-like sacrifice. Paul, as you'll see in next week's passage, is also called to service and sacrifice. How will you respond?

God calls us, former enemies restored to Himself, to follow Him, walking in His strength rather than our own. Doing so, we may be agents of reconciliation, equipped by the Holy Spirit and gospel to carry this message of restoration to families, neighborhoods, workplace and church.

With whom might you walk with as they seek reconciliation to God or others? Do you feel unworthy to tell the story of Christ's work on our behalf? Peter and Paul both felt this way, but followed Jesus and changed the world one heart at a time.
