FLDERS CORNER

A Mother's Love & Walking in the Light

1 John 2:7-11

Let's be honest, Mother's Day sermons can feel a little tricky. How do you honor moms, stay faithful to Scripture, and not make everyone cry in the process? Well, today we're in **1 John 2:7–11**, and while it may not seem like a typical "Mother's Day passage," it fits beautifully.

John reminds us that the command to love isn't new, it's been around since the beginning. But in Jesus, it takes on a whole new depth. And what better real-life picture do we have of that kind of deep, selfless love than a mother?

Most of us have seen that kind of love firsthand. Moms love in ways that defy logic. They wake up early, stay up late, forgive easily, and give generously, most of the time without getting much in return. That's the kind of love that doesn't just feel warm and fuzzy, it points to the light of Christ.

John also gives us a warning in verse 11:

"But whoever hates his brother is in the darkness... the darkness has blinded his eyes."

In other words, bitterness doesn't just mess with our relationships, it clouds our vision. It pulls us away from the light. You can go to church, read your Bible, serve on a team, but if you're holding onto anger or unforgiveness, it's like trying to walk through life with sunglasses on at midnight. You're going to bump into things.

But love, real, Jesus-like love, lights the path. And many of us first saw that kind of love from our moms, grandmas, or spiritual mothers. Maybe she wasn't perfect (no one is), but she showed you what it means to keep loving, even when it's hard. That's walking in the light.

So today, we say thank you to the moms who modeled Christ's love with a hug, a prayer, a packed lunch, or a midnight pep talk. And we also take a moment to look inward: Is there someone we need to forgive? A relationship we need to restore? Let's not just celebrate love today, let's live it.

Because where love lives, light shines. And where light shines, we can see clearly.
