ELDERS CORNER

The Purifying Power of Hope

Titus 2:11–13 (ESV)

"For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people, training us to renounce ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright, and godly lives in the present age, waiting for our blessed hope, the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ..."

While 1 John 3:1–10 contrasts those born of God with those who persist in sin, Titus 2:11–13 highlights how God's grace and our hope in Christ's return work together to train us in godliness.

The "blessed hope" in Titus 2:13 is a clear reference to the second coming of Christ, the same event John refers to when he says, "we shall see him as he is" (1 John 3:2). But Paul adds a rich layer: this hope doesn't merely encourage us; it actively trains us to live holy lives now.

Here's the key: Grace teaches us to renounce sin, and hope motivates us to persevere in purity. Paul sees the anticipation of Christ's return not as distant theology, but as daily instruction, shaping how we think, act, and resist the pull of the world.

Just as 1 John 3:3 says, "everyone who thus hopes in him purifies himself," Titus 2 says that the hope of His appearing teaches us to say no to sin and yes to godliness. This shows that biblical hope is not passive longing, it's an active force for transformation.

In a cultural moment often driven by short-term focus and present gratification, the hope of Christ's return invites us to live differently. Not only because we fear judgment, but because we love His appearing (2 Tim. 4:8) and long to be like Him.

So whether we're teaching from 1 John 3 or Titus 2, the insight is clear: Hope in Christ's return has a purifying, discipling effect. When that hope is cultivated in the heart, it produces people who are not just positionally righteous but practically growing in holiness.
