LAST WEEK'S SERMON

Marks of a Faithful Christian 3 John

Last Sunday, we walked through the short but powerful letter of **3 John**, discovering how deep theology is meant to be lived out in everyday relationships, ministry, and character. John's pastoral heart shines as he commends, warns, and encourages believers to walk faithfully.

Walk in Truth and Love (1-4)

Gaius didn't just believe truth, he walked in it. His life was a living reflection of the Gospel. True Christianity isn't just doctrinal, it's visible in how we live, love, and walk daily.

"Be doers of the word..." (James 1:22)

Practice Hospitality and Support Ministry (5–8)

Gaius supported gospel workers, even strangers, in a manner "worthy of God." Hospitality becomes mission when it serves those who go out for the sake of the Name.

"Contribute to the needs of the saints and seek to show hospitality." (Romans 12:13)

Reject the Prideful Spirit of Diotrephes (9-10)

Diotrephes loved to be first, resisted authority, and divided the church. Pride distorts leadership and quenches fellowship. True authority reflects Christ's humility.

"Do nothing from selfish ambition..." (Philippians 2:3)

Imitate What Is Good (11–12)

Demetrius was a man whose life matched his message. John says to imitate such people. Faithfulness is both visible and worth following.

"Imitate their faith." (Hebrews 13:7)

Live in Peace and Fellowship (13–15)

John longed for face-to-face connection. The Christian life is meant to be lived in close fellowship and intentional love for one another. "Put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony." (Colossians 3:14)

Be like Gaius, walk in truth.

Avoid the spirit of Diotrephes, walk in humility.

Imitate Demetrius, walk in integrity.

Support others joyfully, walk in partnership.

Let's be known not for loud opinions, but for quiet, steady, faithful lives that can teach the Gospel without saying a word. Let's be pillars in the church, not just personalities.
