LAST WEEK'S SERMON

One in Christ: Ephesians 2:11-22

Big Idea: In Christ, those once far off have been reconciled through the cross and built into one new people who belong to Him.

Everyone knows what it feels like to be an outsider. Spiritually, that was our condition before Christ, alienated, hopeless, and without God. But through His cross, Christ has drawn us near, made peace, and built us into God's dwelling place.

1. Remember Who You Were Without Christ (11–12)

Paul calls us to continually remember our lost condition: separated from Christ, alienated from God's people, strangers to His promises, without hope, and without God. Remembering deepens humility and magnifies grace.

2. Rejoice in What Christ Has Done (13-18)

"But now" through Christ's blood, we who were far off are brought near. Christ Himself is our peace, breaking down hostility and reconciling us to God and one another. He creates a new humanity and grants us access to the Father through the Spirit.

3. Rejoice in Who You Are Now (19-22)

No longer strangers, we are citizens in God's kingdom, members of His family, and living stones in His temple. Built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ as the cornerstone, we are joined together as God's dwelling place by the Spirit.

How Do We Respond?

- **Reflect** on who you once were without Christ—never forget the depth of His mercy.
- Rest in the nearness you now have with God through the cross of Christ.
- **Embrace** your identity as a citizen of God's kingdom and a member of His household.

Live as God's dwelling place, growing together in unity, holiness, and gratitude.

Once outsiders, now citizens. Once homeless, now God's household. Once far off, now His temple. Our identity in Christ is secure, eternal, and transformative.
